General comments

Several points were lost due to either the logged callsign or the number received from the other station not matching the callsign or number sent by the station worked. In keeping with normal contest rules, the sender is assumed to have sent the correct sequence number provided it is in sequence, and where errors occur it is presumed that the receiver did not log it correctly.

There is some confusion about whether the sequence used in the two hours should be continuous or whether the number should restart at 001 for the SSB section. Whatever was done by operators was acceptable. We will clarify that next year.

Certificates

Were awarded to the first three logs in each section and also one to Helen VK2FENG for the best Foundation licence score, actually only a point behind the 3rd place in ssb section.

Nice to hear both Mike and Helen operating in the contest this year from their station in Gundaroo, certainly a huge signal at Yass.

Another QRP contest?

Several logs included support for another QRP contest later in the year, with some suggesting 40m and others 80m. These comments will be considered and the contest calendar examined to see what might work and the details will be in LoKey.
