Results of October 2021 QRP Hours contest

This contest we had to contend with the very odd conditions on 40m, which featured long skip distances with large exclusion zones, meaning that often two stations were calling the same station, but could not hear each other. CQs were bound to be made "on top of" other stations, but with such strange conditions, these accidental collisions just have to be borne. For example from Yass I heard only one vk2 station, yet some logs contained contacts with multiple vk2 callsigns.

Nearly all contesters did lodge their logs direct with vklogchecker.com, the website created by Alan VK4SN and his son. Several logs were sent to me direct and I was able to lodge them myself. The logchecker website is a great help to contest managers as it automates the cross-checking of logs.

I entered a small log myself having only spent the second half hour in the CW section and finding very few contacts available on SSB.

Our Lokey editor Terry VK2KTJ operated on a JT mode and made one contact, there could have been many more especially when you consider these modes are good at digging out signals below the noise level.

Alan VK4SN commented that he called on PSK without any responses.

Most of the participants who sent in logs added some "soapbox" comments and I suggest you go to vklogchecker.com to read them.

Score adjustments

The logchecker detected some contacts claimed that were not in the other station's log, a sign of confusing conditions where multiple callers make an operator think they are exchanging numbers with station X when it is really station Y. Such phantom contacts were deleted from claimed scores. No points were lost due to incorrect numbers - everyone got the numbers right.
